

Local 1846 Trade Show Information



Trade Show Work (New Orleans ~~Morial~~ Convention Center)

You will need to get a badge to work at the Convention Center, located at 900 Convention Center ~~boulevard~~, New Orleans, LA 70130. It costs \$5.00; it's best to have the exact amount. The hours to get a badge are 6:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. Monday – Thursday with lunch being from 11:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon. Go down Julia Street to the back of Hall A, to the employees' entrance, fill out the paperwork from the guard behind the Security Window and tell them you are working for the company you were referred to or just from the Carpenters Local Union 1846.

Parking

Parking is available next to Hall J, at the other end of the Convention Center off of Henderson Street in front of the Flood Wall. You need \$5.00 exactly; they have a parking pay station next to Henderson Street near the front end of the lot. After you purchase your parking pass/ticket, remember to put the receipt on your dashboard of your vehicle, so it can be seen through the window. After parking, you will go behind the Convention Center, pass the Security Guard where the semi-trucks enter and proceed to the back of the appropriate Hall, where you will sign in with the company you are scheduled to work for (note: when working for a smaller I & D Co. you will be required to report directly to a booth). You must be there for 7:30 to sign in where you can begin working at 8:00 a.m.

Hiring Process

You must take your Picture ID and Social Security Card and fill out an I-9 and W-4 Form, each time you go to work for a new/different employer. Whenever you are going to work, you must always have your Convention Center badge and enter from the back of the Convention Center, either through the back by Hall A or Hall J. **NEVER enter through the front door!** You **must** always have all of your tools on the required tool list when going to work at the Convention Center.

Local 1846 Trade Show Contract Addendum



The following addendum has been taken directly out of the Trade Show contract and the tool list has been approved by the Regional Council and will be the minimum tools Brotherhood members will have with them while in the employ of any signatory contractor.

ADDENDUM #1

REQUIRED TOOL LIST FOR ALL TRADE SHOW WORK

Any person who does not have the required tools when a tool check is performed will be paid at 60% of the journeyman's pay rate for that day

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Although the 3/8" Cordless Drill is a required tool we understand that not all jobs require the use of one. That is why the following language has been added.

It is understood that all union members on any trade show, commercial or non-commercial must have all the required tools with the exception of 1st & 2nd year apprentices which are not required to have a cordless drill but it is highly encouraged for them to purchase one as soon as they are able to. This is especially important if they are working in the I & D or Gem/MIS/Metal departments for any of the companies.

Any member who does not regularly work in, the I & D or GEM/MIS/Metal Department will not be required to have their cordless drill with them at all times **although it is highly recommended**. These members **must** have all the other required tools and have **reasonable access** to their own personal cordless drill as described below in case they are assigned to work in one of those departments.

Any member who **regularly works in or is assigned to work in** the I & D or MIS/GEM/Metal Department is required to have a cordless drill with them every day they work in those departments. Any member who has not been pre-assigned to the I & D or GEM/MIS/Metal Department, and they get assigned to one of those Departments during the call, must have **reasonable access** to their cordless drill.

Reasonable access is defined as meaning;

It is in their car and they can go and get it and be back to the sign in table with it within 10 minutes.

Random tools checks will be performed and if any member assigned to go to work in the I & D or Gem/MIS/Metal or any other department that does not have all the required tools as set forth, with them or in their car, they will be notified in the presence of the union steward that their wage rate will be lowered to the first year apprentice wage rate of 60% for that day.
